This overview included the diversity of notable historic work from each commission in an effort to protect the natural resources of the Flathead Basin and support the prevention of AIS in the Upper Columbia River Basin. Casey Lewis provided an overview of each section of Senate Bill 83, the enabling legislation of WMCC as part of Governor Gianforte's Red Tape Initiative. This bill aimed to consolidate FBC & UC3 that have overlapping goals for protecting water quality, expand impact of FBC's success across western MT, and streamline staff, budget, and other logistical aspects. The termination date is June 30, 2029. Casey Lewis provided an overview of the W9 and travel reimbursement forms for commission members. Stephanie Murphy presented the parting thoughts from FBC & UC3 provided during each commission's last meeting. This reflection includes both strengths of each commission and goals for WMCC as recommended by FBC & UC3 staff and commission members.

Casey Lewis provided an overview of the requirements for an Executive Committee as dictated by state law: the executive committee, at a minimum, consists of the Chair, Vice Chair, and one or more voting members for a 2-year term. Non-voting commission members may serve in an advisory capacity. Casey Lewis called for those interested in serving on the Executive Committee. Voting members, Sandy Beder-Miller, Phil Matson, Arthur Potts, Lech Naumovich, Tracy Campbell, and Rich Janssen, and non-voting members, Mark Bostrom and Kate Wilson, proposed to serve on the committee. Mike Koopal and Onno Wieringa proposed to serve as Chair or Vice Chair. Motion was made by Randy Brodehl for Mike Koopal to serve as Chair and Onno Wieringa to serve as Vice Chair and to include the rest of the interested members to serve on the executive committee; seconded by Duane Braaten. Mike Koopal and Onno Wieringa abstained from the vote. Motion passes. Kelly Hendrix provided a handout with reflection questions addressing potential committee structure and allowed time for commission members to begin filling this out. Casey Lewis called for commission members to share thoughts on interests and positions for committees.
