Casey Lewis provided an overview of WMCC staff roles and responsibilities. Mike Koopal provided updates from the Executive Committee: new staff hiring proccess, building framework of strategic vision, proposing committee structures, establishing executive committee structure, and preparing for meeting today. The Executive Committee's next meeting is February 13, 2024. Stephanie Murphy presented an overview of recent staff updates and projects including onboarding new staff, commission foundation building work, presenting at the Water Policy Interim Committee (WPIC), responding to media requests, meeting with partners, and planning future workshops. She provided a preview of WMCC's website-in-development. Kristen Jordan presented an overview of EPA Grant progress: new staff reviewing extensive background of grant and grant requirements, attending grant kickoff meeting with EPA, and beginning to build programs. Mark Bostrom introduced WMCC's Conflict of Interest (COI) form for commission members. Mark Bostrom presented pros and cons of WMCC in a role of grantor or grantee for DNRC grants.

Strategic Visioning Lech Naumovich, Principal and Ecologist at Greater Than Image, LLC Casey Lewis, WMCC Executive Director	 Casey Lewis provided an overview of strategic visioning process and exercises. Emilie Henry facilitated strategic vision discussion in small groups. Lech Naumovich closed out the discussion. Mike Koopal called for comments on strategic vision. Motion was made by Lech Naumovich to table this discussion until staff have reviewed the feedback and updated the strategic vision draft; seconded by Randy Brodehl. Motion passes.
Public Comment Mike Koopal, WMCC Chair	 Mike Koopal called for public comment. Vicki Watson, Professor Emeritus of University of Montana, requested WMCC to consider taking on tasks from the Clark Fork Kootenai River Basins Council, previously called the Clark Fork Task Force, including the Watershed Restoration Plan for the Central Clark Fork. Mayre Flowers from Citizens for a Better Flathead requested WMCC to provide letter of support for the Coalition for Clean CFAC's petition of the US EPA and MT DEQ to pause and provide additional analyses before moving forward with clean-up plan of the Columbia Falls Aluminum Company Superfund site. She also requests WMCC to consider more effective waste treatment in Flathead especially during tomorrow's Onsite Wastewater Panel. Senator Willis Curdy commended Randy Brodehl and Senator Mike Cuffe for their efforts in supporting AIS funding during legislative sessions. He commended Tom Woolf, the CSKT, the Blackfeet, and Conservation Districts for their partnership supporting AIS work, and the electric co-ops for funding programs. Senator Curdy reminded the commission of the termination date for section 6 of Montana HB0411 that provided funding for AIS programs and requested support for extending or eliminating the sunset date. Senator Curdy thanked WMCC for speaking at the Water Policy Interim Committee (WPIC) and asks WMCC to support legislation, assist Montana communities with septic issues, and recommends reading the Montana State Drought Management Plan. Sara Edinberg, WMCC member and Assistant Research Hydrogeologist for Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology, shared information about the next Montana American Water Resources Association Conference in Whitefish, Montana October 9-11, 2024. She requested ideas for field trips in the Whitefish area for the conference. Seeing no further comments, Mike Koopal closed public comments.
